Berrien County Road Department Projects for Lake Charter Township

Jericho Road from Shawnee to Snow 1.5 miles \$20,000.00; Baldwin Road from city limits to Snow .5 miles \$63,172.82; Gast Road from Shawnee to Snow 1.5 miles \$26,800.00; Floral Lane from Red Arrow to end (East and West) .44 miles \$6,800.00 and Lange Road from Snow to the end .62 miles \$13,800.00.

It was discussed that we opt to remove Floral Lane and Lange Road from the Road Department's projects so residents can be notified and their questions can be answered.

After discussion and removing Floral Lane and Lange Road from the Road Department projects, it was moved by Payne seconded by Wilk to approve the remaining road work projects by the Road Department in the amount of \$109,972.82. Six ayes, motion carried.

John Deere Gator

It was moved by Stine seconded by Heyn to table this agenda item to gather other quotes for a more utility type unit for use in the Park. Six ayes, motion carried.

Electric Valve Wrench

Supervisor Pro Tem Clark turned the floor over to Jeff Burkhard, Water Plant Superintendent and Toban Riley, Assistant Water Plant Superintendent who reported that this item is a 2018-budgeted item and is now ready to be purchased. A quote from E.H. Wachs for an electric torque-controlled wrench, with a tee handle for \$8,425.00 was discussed.

After discussion, it was moved by Stine seconded by Payne to purchase the electric torque-controlled wrench, with a tee handle from E.H. Wachs in the amount of \$8,425.00. Six ayes, motion carried.
